If there is any behaviour like this I will have no other option but to issue the Inclosed Lands Protection Act, which will mean you can no longer access the school grounds. If you have any concerns please speak with your child's class teacher or stage assistant principal.

Commonwealth Bank School Banking Update – Please Read

Cessnock City Library

Cessnock City Library subscribes to a tutoring service called Yoututor. Through this service students from Year 3 to Year 12 and TAFE can access from tutoring in English, Maths, Science and assignment and research help. To be able to use this service all your students need is a Cessnock City Library card. Students with assignments can also upload their assignment to the service and receive feedback from a tutor with qualifications in the assignment subject area within twenty-four hours. All tutors who work at the service are working with children approved and have qualifications in their subject area.

The same subscription allows the library to provide a service called Lifelong Learning, for students/adults who are in the job market. This service provides help with skills in Job searching, writing and finding information. To access this service students/adults need a library card.

Overdue Library Items



Trophy hunting should be made illegal

Currently in the country there is a debate over whether or not trophy hunting should be made illegal. The recent illegal killing of Cecil, one of Africa's most famous lions has increased calls to outlaw trophy hunting. Cecil was stalked for 40 hours, shot, skinned and beheaded by an American dentist, Walter James Palmer. Cecil was not a serious threat to humans and was part of the Oxford University study that had run since 1999.

Trophy hunting is already illegal in some countries and some international airlines have stopped allowing people to take trophies back into the country. In Australia it is already illegal to bring trophies back into Australia and some say others should do the same. If trophy hunting still remains our ecosystem would be out of balance, regards to having less animals in Hwange national park and all over Africa.

On the other side, some conservationists even support trophy hunting, and some of the money can go to help poor communities. Trophy hunting is legal in some countries and the proceeds go towards conservation effort and humanitarian aids. People usually only shoot or kill animals that can't reproduce. It could be an ok thing if it is done correctly and controlled, for example a sick or unwell animal.

Trophy hunting should not be a sport. Every year up to 200 rhinos die due to trophy hunting. Thousands of tourists visit African countries each year to see animals, with trophy hunting those thousands of tourists won't come back to see the animals, because there won't be any. So that's why we are trying to protect these beautiful animals from disappearing!

Trophy hunting is expensive. You must pay up to \$60,000 for a permit to hunt. Surely not that many people can afford this so not that many people will hunt these animals.

After looking at both sides, I strongly believe that trophy hunting should be illegal. We are just killing our beautiful animals, it is just cruel and unnecessary. Why do people want to kill them? They're wonderful.

Trophy hunting should be made illegal

Currently in the Community there is a debate over whether or not trophy hunting should be made illegal. At the same time, if we allow trophy hunting to continue, our ecosystem will be out of balance. At least 200 rhinos are killed each year. Did you know Cecil was apart of the Oxford University study that was in operation since 1999? We want to protect the animals, not kill them.

However, trophy hunting can be a good thing if done correctly. Some of this money goes towards endangered animals. Only hunt animals that can't reproduce, and proceeds go to conservation humanitarian efforts, then surely it's not a bad thing.

After looking at both sides, I reckon you should not be killing animals. Instead, the money usefully like a holiday or a car or something else.

The NPS canteen is excited to introduce a new online canteen lunch ordering system called Flexischools. The system is NOW available for all recess and lunch canteen orders.

Flexischools is well established and tested, already operating in hundreds of schools across Australia.

Flexischools allows parents and staff to place orders from home, work or school at any time via your computer, phone or tablet (you can even add the Flexischools website as a homepage on your mobile or tablet, which will work just like an app! See directions on the Flexischools website, www.flexischools.com.au, under the FAQs section).

Why Use Online Ordering?

- The payment is managed online so less paper bags, cash and envelopes are sent via your child to school.
- By paying online there is no fumbling around with coins in the morning or sending kids to school with excess cash.
- As well as being convenient for parents, the online orders are much faster and easier for our canteen volunteers to process.
- Online canteen orders are more accurate giving parents peace of mind that their child's canteen order and payment is received and processed correctly.

So it makes everyone's life a little easier!

How do I start?

Getting online is easy and it only takes a few minutes to register.

1. Simply go to www.flexischools.com.au and click "Register Now".
2. Add your student, their school and class to get started.
3. Top-Up your account via Visa, Mastercard, PayPal or direct deposit.
4. Make an order by selecting from the menu range.
5. Make payment for the order listed in your order pad.
6. Review Orders by logging back in to your Flexischools account.

Once registered you can start placing orders immediately and you can set recurring orders, view transaction history or cancel orders via your Flexischools login.

Please note that online ordering closes at 9.30am each day – any orders after this time need to be directly handed to the canteen volunteers.

If your child already has a cloth canteen lunch bag then please make sure they place it in the lunchbox outside the canteen each morning when they've placed an online canteen order.

What does it cost?

There are a number of payment options including PayPal, Visa and Mastercard (credit and debit) or direct bank transfer.

Online Ordering Fees – at this stage the NPS canteen will be absorbing the \$0.25 online order fee – this means there is no cost to submit your canteen order online.

Account Top-Up Fees Direct Deposit - free, Credit card (Visa or Mastercard only) - \$0.29, PayPal - \$0.35.

What Gonski means for your child

National Gonski Week is taking place from July 28 to August 1 and it is an ideal opportunity to focus on what the benefits of additional resources are for your child and our school.

Gonski, as you may know, is a way of funding schools based on the needs of students. It was recommended by the Gonski Review that found too many students were missing out due to a lack of resources.

For us, the additional Gonski funding over the next six years will allow us to really expand the educational programs and learning support we know will make a difference in what our students achieve.

With this funding we will be able to:

- put in place additional literacy and numeracy programs and provide one-on-one assistance to students at risk of falling behind
- increase the specialist support and assistance for students who really need it — such as those with disabilities or special learning needs
- take a whole-of-school approach to building the skills and knowledge of teachers
- provide extension programs that will help teachers really push our smartest students to do even better.

The one problem we have is that the Federal Government, in the May Budget, announced it will only provide the Gonski funding we are relying on for four years, not six. That is a serious issue because only one-third of the funding comes in the first four years.

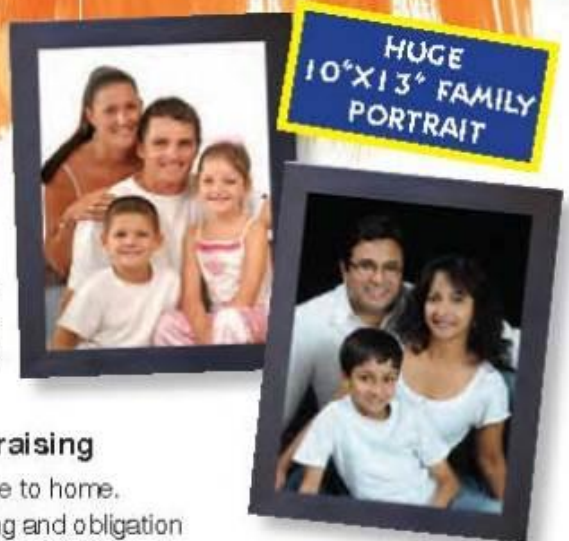

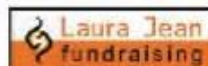

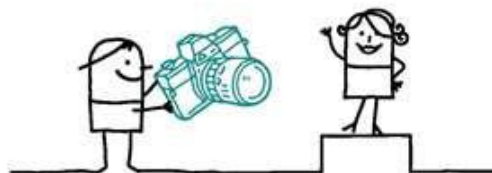
