## School Upgrade

### Class 5-6P

It is hard to believe that we are now into Term 4. Before long, we will be saying goodbye to our Year 6 students, as they head into High School. As always, Term 4 is an extremely busy time for Stage 3. We started with our new project launch 'Plastic, not so fantastic'. This project will focus on the issue of waste, and in particular plastic. The launch was a very informative day for our students, starting with each class watching a documentary on the impacts of waste in our oceans. Each student made a 'newspaper cone' that they ate their popcorn out of and drank fruit juice from a biodegradable cup. The goal is for all students to use the newspaper and cup to plant a small garden near our classrooms (using all our waste in the process). Students then rotated around classrooms completing activities such as; making beeswax wraps, recycling t-shirts into bags, making newspaper pods and coils and using technology to monitor waste. The day finished with our local council coming into the school to do a classroom waste audit. It was eye opening and quite concerning to see the amount of waste we make as a school each day!

Last week we also saw the beginning of a three week program in Rugby League skills. The NRL send two qualified coaches for 30 minute sessions to teach the students skills and drills in League. It is a lot of fun for all involved.

Year 5 are now looking to the future and the process of leadership for 2019 is underway. Students will be asked to nominate themselves to be a candidate for a school leader by the end of Week 4. Initial speeches will be delivered to Stage 3 in Week 5. With the final 10 boys and girls delivering their speeches to the school in Week 7. Good luck to all involved.

Interrelate will run in Weeks 4 and 5 for our Year 6 students. The focus this year is on personal development as well as body image.

### Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is spending \$6 billion over four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools. The budget also includes an additional \$160 million in 2018/19 as part of the record \$747 million maintenance investment announced last year. This is the biggest investment in public school infrastructure in the history of NSW.

### Nulkaba Public School project

A project is underway to upgrade Nulkaba Public School to create an innovative learning environment and to meet growing student enrolments. The project will deliver 14 new adaptable and innovative learning spaces, an upgrade of administration spaces and staff and student amenities.

### Progress summary

Site signage and fencing has been installed around the work area and the contractor Hansen Yuncken has cleared the site, completed excavation and constructed the footings and ground floor slabs for the new building. Next steps are:

- Ongoing relocation of existing services
- Formwork and concrete pours

### Construction update

During construction, the contractors will follow rigorous processes to ensure the safety of students, staff, contractors, parents and other visitors to the site. We will work closely with the Principal to minimise any disruptions. As part of site management:

- Contractors will enter the site via dedicated entryways
- Measures will be put in place to ensure access around school grounds is managed.
- A section of Rothbury Street has been designated contractor parking. Once full, all other contractor personnel will be required to park remotely from the site.
- Contractor deliveries will be scheduled to minimise impacts to kiss and drop peak times.
- Work hours are between 7am to 5pm Monday to Saturday. No work will occur on Sundays or public holidays.



Water is the best drink as it does not have any added sugar. Fruit juices, soft drink, sports drinks or cordials should not be given to your child everyday as they contain a lot of added sugar. Tap water is the best choice. In most areas, tap water contains fluoride, which helps children to develop strong teeth.

### HOW MUCH SUGAR IS IN THAT DRINK?

### TIPS TO HELP YOUR KID DRINK MORE WATER

- Show children that you enjoy drinking water.
- Drink water with every meal.
- Take a refillable bottle of water when you go out.
- Pack water with your child's lunch.
- Encourage your child to drink water when they play sports.
- Limit buying sugar-sweetened drinks.

## The simplest way

...to use shade!

Shade is one of the easiest ways to protect yourself from the sun. Using shade can reduce your UV exposure by up to 75 per cent!

There are plenty of different types of shade including trees, tents and shade sails. All of these provide good protection from UV radiation.



**Remember to lead by example!**

Children learn from adults around them so make sure that you are seeking out shade when you go outside. Encourage children to think about where the shade is and move throughout the day to stay safe.

For total sun protection, make sure that you Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek and Slide whenever the UV is above 3.

## What does volunteering in the Canteen involve?

- The hours are 9.15am to 2'ish. Volunteers start when school goes in and close the canteen at the second lunch bell (2pm), although the final clean up and counting the takings may take longer.
- Tea and instant coffee are supplied free and canteen volunteers are entitled to one free lunch item and one free drink. Please pay for any other purchases.
- Your kids will love the days that you are on canteen and everything seems "free" to them. Please run a tab to pay at the end of the day (and ask another volunteer to handle the payment).
- Unfortunately no children (babies, toddlers or school age) are permitted in the canteen due to health and safety requirements.
