


We met a tiny, long necked turtle who was about the size of a 20cent coin. It was such a great time getting to meet reptiles that we don't usually get to come across.

We learnt that snakes don't have ears so you can scream when you see them, but stand still or slowly walk in the opposite direction. We learnt that the shingle back lizard has a lunch box to store his food for winter and his tail looks like his head so he can trick predators.
